

## Bridging the Gap: Peliešac Nears Completion Construction began in July 2018

on the Pelješac Bridge connecting the Croatian mainland and the Pelješac Peninsula, and bypassing, for automobile, truck and bus traffic, a short strip of Bosnia and Herzegovina's territory. The 2.4-km (1.5 mi) cable-stayed bridge over the Mali Ston Bay of the Adriatic Sea will now allow Croatian travelers full access to the length of the country without passing through the BiH checkpoints at Neum. The final span was lifted into place on the evening of July 28 with the final welding completed about 1 am. Although fully connected, the bridge and its access roads will not be open to passenger traffic until June 2022. There have been numerous suggestions for an "official" name for the bridge (among them "Marco Polo Bridge" and "Nikola Tesla Bridge") but for now, the name Pelješac Bridge is its only moniker. The bridge project was designed by Slovenian engineer Marjan Pipenbaher and is being constructed by China

Road and Bridge Corporation. Total cost of the project is estimated at 420.3 million Euros (481.5 million dollars).
